

## May 2015 Result: Running 3.8% Ahead of ASX200 for the Month

The **Australian CleanTech Index** gained 3.6% in May 2015, outperforming its benchmark indices and reversing most of April's losses.

The Australian CleanTech Index rose from 44.57 to 46.15 over the month of May recording a **3.6% gain**. This compared to the S&P ASX200 loss of 0.2% and the S&P ASX Small Ordinaries Index gain of 2.3%. The **Australian CleanTech 20** recorded a 3.4% gain.

The six and twelve month performances of the Index also remain ahead of both benchmarks with a **24.2% gain recorded over the last 12 months**.

The best performing sub-indices for the month were the Australian Waste Index with a gain of 6.7% and the Australian Efficiency & Storage Index with a 6.3% gain. The weakest sub-index through May was the Australian Environment Index recording a loss of 1.4%.

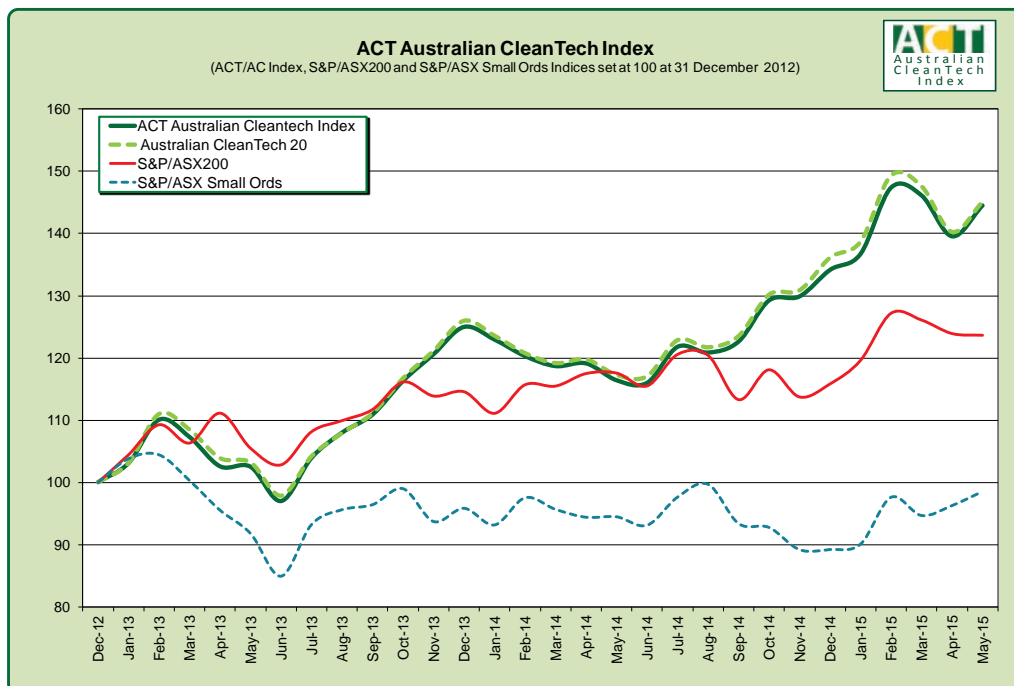
The market capitalisation of the 64 stocks in the Australian CleanTech Index is A\$18.7 billion close to March's record of \$18.9 billion and up over three times from its low of A\$6.2 billion in July 2012.

The month's performance was driven by 15 companies with **gains of more than 10%**. The greatest percentage gains were recorded by **Eden Energy (EDE)**, **CleanTeQ (CLQ)** and **Enerji (ERJ)**. The greatest market capitalisation gain was recorded by **Meridian Energy (MEZ)**.

These gains were partially offset by 8 companies recording **losses of more than 10%** led by **Energy Action (EAX)**, **Actinogen (ACW)** and **Environmental Group (EGL)**. The greatest market capitalisation loss was recorded again by **Mighty River Power (MYT)**.
